Agriculture Sector now accounts for 30.8 percent of GDP compared to 24.7 percent in 2007. This achievement is entirely due to the significantly higher increases in agricultural, forestry and fish prices compared to the more subdued price increases for

most other industries.

#### **Seaweed production**

ceaweed farming is a wellestablished industry Zanzibar. It has created more than 25,000 jobs to indigenous people, especially women and gives them an opportunity to earn an income for themselves

and their families. Zanzibar is the third largest exporter of seaweed in the world, after the Philippines and Indonesia. Her exports for spinosum reached 15,000 tons in 2012. However, production of cottonii which is grown in deep water was less than 600 tons.



There is great potential for investors to increase seaweed production specifically cottonii and produce seaweed by-products such as perfumes, shampoos, toothpaste, medicines, ice cream, milk shakes, and yoghurt by using seaweed extracts such as carrageen, agar, and alginates as gelling substances, stabilizers and emulsifiers.

# 3.0 Investment climate



anzibar economy has been stable for years. GDP growth increased from 4.2 percent in 2008 to 6.6 percent 2015. Similarly, per capita income increased from US\$ 499 in 2008 to 817 in 2015. This is a tremendous achievement as the

growth exhibits gradual growth from 2008 to 2015.

#### 3.2 Workforce

There is ample hardworking, energetic and dynamic work force to serve investment projects. While investors are encouraged to set their own competitive compensation packages, labour laws and regulations are already in place.



### 3.3 Economic Infrastructure

#### **Electricity**

Zanzibar (Unguja) is connected to the national (Mainland Tanzania) power grid through underwater submarine cables with a capacity of 150MW. It has also standby generators with capacity of 25MW. Likewise, her sister island of Pemba is connected through submarine cable from Tanga (Mainland Tanzania) with a capacity of 20MW and has standby diesel oil-run generators with a capacity of 5MW. The applicable current is 220V which conforms to British standards. The cost of electricity in United States dollars (US\$) per KWH is provided under table I below:

#### Water

Zanzibar has adequate water reserves for industrial and household use. Minimum infrastructure is still needed to ensure water supply reaches every part of the Islands. The commercial rate is US\$ 1 per cubic meter.

#### **Telecommunication**

Telecommunication system in Zanzibar is excellent, both for local and international calls. Mobile phone technology is available and most advanced. The country is well served by the main 6 telecommunication companies operating not only

in United Republic of Tanzania but also in the East African Region and beyond. These are TTCL, ZANTEL, HALOTEL, TIGO, VODACOM and AIRTEL. The rates are reasonable. Internet services are also available at very competitive rates.

#### **Roads**

Zanzibar has about 1,600 kilometers of roads, of which 85 percent are tarmacked or semitarmacked. Most of investment areas are covered by tarmac roads. The remaining (15%) are earth roads, which are rehabilitated annually to make them passable throughout the year.





#### **Airport**

Zanzibar has two major airports, one in Unguja (International Airport) and the other one in Pemba. The International Airport has been handling large passenger planes since 2012. As a result there has been an increase in passenger and cargo inflows and outflows. With the new passenger terminal to be launched soon, the airport is expected to serve about 1.5 million passengers per year from mid 2017. Pemba airport is for domestic and light weight flights from neighboring countries.

#### **Sea Port**

There are five sea ports in Zanzibar, all operated and managed by the Zanzibar Ports Corporation. The main port at Malindi handles 90 percent of

Zanzibar's trade, followed by Mkoani port at Pemba. The other ports are Wete, Mkokotoni and Wesha. Plans are under way to establish a hub port at Mpigaduri area in Zanzibar. This new initiative is expected to expand opportunities in re-export business.

#### **Financial Services**

Local, regional and international financial institutions offer a wide range of services in Zanzibar. The People's Bank of Zanzibar, Barclays Bank, Tanzania Postal Bank, Bank of Africa, Diamond Trust, Equity Bank, and Exim Bank are among the reputable banks that have set businesses in Zanzibar. In addition, there are various insurance companies and a number of bureau de change outlets that offer service to interested customers.

#### **Acquisition of Land** 3.4

Land in Zanzibar is owned by the Government. It can be acquired by lease of up to 99 years for investment projects.

#### **Acquisition of Land outside Free Economic Zones**

The acquisition of land is governed by the Commission for Land (COLA) through the Department of Lands and Registration. However, the signing of a lease agreement with COLA is subject to approval of investment project by ZIPA. The indicate land rates outside Free Economic zones is provided under table 2 below:

#### 3.6 Investment Guarantee

Investments in Zanzibar are constitutionally protected, as well as through international conventions, of which Zanzibar being a constituting part of the

United Republic of Tanzania, is a member of Multilateral Investment Guarantee Agency (MIGA) of the World Bank. Also, Tanzania is a signatory to the Convention of Recognition Enforcement Arbitration Award, and a member of International Centre for Settlement of Investment Disputes (ICSID). Contractual rights are guaranteed by the law of contract whereby mechanism for settlement of disputes through arbitration and judicial process are clearly stipulated.

#### **How to Apply for Investment Certificate**

Application of Investment Certificate involves two stages as follow:

#### Stage 1:

Submission of concept note through Investment Intention Form which is available free of charge at ZIPA offices or can be accessed through its website www.zanzibarinvest.org

Once your concept note is accepted, you shall be notified and provided with application form for a non-refundable fee of US\$ 200 or informed otherwise.

#### **Stage 2: Submission of Application Form**

A dully filled application form should be submitted to ZIPA, accompanied with the following documents:

- Ten (10) copies of Business Plan/feasibility study
- Proof of availability of funds and bank statements for the last six months
- Passport copies, passport size photographs, CV and police clearance certificates of all investors/shareholders from country of residence and country of origin
- Certificate of Incorporation
- Memorandum and Article of Association

#### **Investment Certificate Fee**

Once investment proposal is approved by ZIPA, the investor is issued with Interim Certificate. The Certificate is renewed annually until all approved capital is invested. Thereafter Investment Service License shall apply. The fee structure for the Interim Certificate is provided below:

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### 4.3 Investment Incentives

offers lucrative f **7**anzibar package of incentives. Some Incentives provided under the Zanzibar Investment Promotion and Protection Act No. 11 of 2004 include the following:

- 1. Project approved under Free Economic Zone regime may enjoy the following i. incentives:
- a. 10 Year Corporate Tax Holiday and 25% Tax for the subsequent ten years.
- b. 10 Year Withholding Tax Holiday on dividend to nonresidents.
- c. 75% Duty and VAT Exemption on raw materials, machinery, equipment and other inputs.
- d. Stamp Duty Exemption.
- e. 100% investment deduction |... on capital expenditure within 20 years.

- Exemption from tax on dividend for ten years.
- Duty and Tax Free Import of goods from domestic tariff area permissible.
- h. Duty Free import of material for construction of factory buildings.
- Duty Free export of goods produced.
- Exemption of Income Tax on interest on borrowed capital.
- Exemption from payment of all taxes and levies imposed local government authorities for goods and services produced in a Free Economic Zones. (Is this facility forever? If not indicate the period applicable)
- On site customs inspection of goods in lieu of off-port inspection.



- a. Exemption from payment of import duty, exercise duty, a. sales tax, (VAT) and any other import levy on all goods imported into the Freeport Zones.
- b. Exemption from any tax on all goods destined for reexports.
- c. Exemptions from local taxes against all goods produced in the Free ports that are exported.
- d. Exemption from payment of Corporate Tax for the first twenty (20) years.
- e. No limit to the durations that goods may be stored in the Freeport Zones.
- f. Hundred percent (100%) retention of all profits.
- g. Hundred percent (100%) foreign ownership allowed.
- h. Free repatriation of profit.
- Twenty percent (20 %) of total turnover allowed for sale to the local market and subject to the payment of all taxes.

- **Freeport and Free Economic** Zones may enjoy the following incentives:
- During the construction phase for an approved enterprise, approved domestic enterprise, the enterprise shall be exempted 75 % from customs and import duties and other similar taxes on machinery, equipment, spare parts, raw materials, vehicles and other goods necessary and exclusively required by that enterprise for the construction phase.
- b. Raw materials for the trial operations of an approved enterprise or approved domestic enterprise may be exempted from import duties.
- c. Provided the quantity of such raw materials does exceed eighteen not months' supply for one shift production operation.
- d. Five year tax holiday.



# **Application procedures for Corporate Tax exemption**



# Investors may apply for corporate tax exemption after fulfilling the following conditions:

- a. Invest not less than the capital specified in the feasibility study;
- b. Start business operation

The application must be accompanied with:

- i. Audited Final Accounts
- ii. Progress Report of the project
- iii. Tax clearance certificate
- iv. Valid Business license

#### Note:

Application for Corporate Tax exemption shall be made within the first two years of business operation

# **Application procedures for exemption of import duties and similar taxes**

Investors shall submit to ZIPA a list i. of all capital goods to be imported as well as to be purchased locally for consideration and where ii. appropriate granted exemption. iii. The list should be submitted in iv. both hard and soft copy.

# (a) Exemption of imported goods

For each consignment of approved imported materials, an investor may apply for exemption in writing to ZIPA at least 2 weeks before arrival of goods in Zanzibar and submit together with the application 2 sets of the following documents:

- Bill of Lading/Air way Bill/
  Consignment notes/Local
  sale advise
- ii. Customs Single Bill of Entry
- iii. Invoices
- iv. Packing list

# (b) Exemption of VAT on local purchase

For every material to be purchased locally, the investor may apply for Value Added Tax (VAT) relief to ZIPA and submit two sets of the following:

- i. A dully filled Value Added Tax form issued by Zanzibar Revenue Board
- ii. Two copies of pro forma invoice

#### Note:

For all goods exampted, Investor shall pay 5% of the total amount of exampted duties to ZIPA as service charge



### 4.4 Work and Residence Permits.



anzibar Investment Promotion and Protection Act No.11 of 2004 provides an opportunity for the approved projects to employ expatriates in key positions that are determined by ZIPA. The issuance of Work and

Residence Permits is governed by Employment Act No. 11 of 2005 and Immigration Act No.7 of 1995 respectively. The following is important information to be considered by investors on application of those permits:



#### **Important information on permit application**

- i. All permit applications should be submitted to ZIPA office at Maruhubi on working days from 0800hrs to 1400hrs
- ii. All documents should be submitted in English or Swahili language. The State University of Zanzibar (SUZA) and Investors' respective Embassies may be used for documents translation (if ix. The issuance of Work and necessary).
- iii. All applications should be accompanied with all required documents. Incomplete applications shall not be received.
- iv. Full submission of documents does not guarantee the issuance of permits. The **Authorities** Competent reserve the right to approve/ disapprove any application.
- v. All Academic and Professional x. All approved Permit/Passport certificates must be certified by Competent Authorities such as University, High Court and the like
- vi. Evidence of original Police Clearance shall be required during submission of the application which for Investors should bring with them during the submission of application.
- vii. Permit renewal must be done timely to avoid penalty. Any delay in submitting application to ZIPA for renewal of permits shall attract a penalty of United State Dollars ten (US\$

- 10) payable to ZIPA for each delayed day for both investor as well as expatriates.
- viii.Investors shall bring with them passport of the applicant for any permit cancellation application. Failure to submit the passport, Investor shall be liable to a penalty of US\$ 300, payable to ZIPA.
- Residence permits shall not exceed 14 working days from the date of submission. Investors are advised to make their payment on time to avoid unnecessary delays. All payment should be deposited to PBZ Bank at account number 052103000027 for Work permit and account number 022102000005 for Residence permit.
- shall be collected at ZIPA on working days from 1300hrs to1500hrs.
- xi. The wage of every employee shall be payable in legal tender directly deposited to each employee's local bank account and any agreement to the contrary shall be null and void.
- xii. It is an offence for any foreigner to work without a valid work permit. It is also an offence for any employer to employ or permit any foreigner without a valid work permit to work in his or her establishment.

#### Note:

- i. The recruitment of non-citizens in any investment project should not exceed fifteen percent (15%) of the total labor force of the project.
- ii. "Managerial Position" means a position which requires professional qualifications and managerial experience which may be filled permanently by an expatriate as long as the project is in operation.
- iii. "Executive Position" means a time position which requires professional qualifications and practical experience.
- iv. "Non-executive Position" means a time position which requires technical skills and experience (applicable during construction phase only).
- v. Competent authorities reserve the right to further limit/add number of expatriates depending on the nature of the business.

Work permit is issued by Labor Commission through ZIPA and is annually renewable. The current fee structure for work permit (in US\$) is provided below:

#### **Temporary Work Permit**

This permit is issued for temporary assignment for a period of less than six (6) months. The application shall be made in writing to ZIPA and accompanied with the following documents:-

- iv Two original contract of the assignment and its copy
- v Business Visa or Business Pass

# 5.0 Transfer of shares and

**Management Company** 

IPPA allows investors to transfer/sell their shares or engage another company to run the business under the following procedures:



#### 5.1 Procedures for Transfer of shares

nvestors shall inform ZIPA whenever there is Change of Ownership and submit to ZIPA the following documents:

- Company Board Resolution approved by Registrar of Companies which states number of shares transferred or sold.
- ii. CV, Police Clearance, passport copies and photos of the new Directors/shareholders
- iii. For a Company as new shareholder – Memorandum and Article of Association of the new shareholder and shareholders detail (Both

company and person)
iv. Pay service charges to ZIPA

#### Note:

- 1. Investors shall pay to ZIPA 1.5% of the share transferred on approved capital investment as indicated in the feasibility study, as service charges.
- Notwithstanding number 1

   (above), an investor shall pay to ZIPA 1.5% of share transferred on actual investment capital if the capital investment exceed the approved capital indicated in the feasibility study, as service charges.

# 5.2 Management Company/Renting the investment

nvestor shall inform ZIPA whenever they decide to rent/lease or engage Management Company to run the business and submit to ZIPA the following documents:

- i. Contact between the investor and lessee/Management company
- ii. A letter of guarantee that approves company's asset shall be used as security for any transaction to be made between management company and a third party such as supplier, employees and the like.
- iii. Details of lessee which include CV, Police Clearance, passport copies and passport photograph
- iv. For Company as lessee –
   Memorandum and Article of Association
- v. The Management Company shall pay required fee annually until the end of contract.

### **5.3 Other Business** Facilitation

ZIPA may facilitate work and residence permits for expatriates of a domestic company wishing to employ expatriates in key positions. The application must be done in writing and accompanied with the following documents:

- i. All documents required for issuance of permits for an approved enterprise or approved domestic enterprise
- ii. Company Memorandum and Article of Association
- iii. Business License from regulated MDAs or competent authorities
- iv. Pay to ZIPA facilitation fees amounting to US\$ 300 annually
- Pay Work and Residence Permit fee at Labor Commission and Immigration Department respectively.

### **Eligibility**

To be authorized to establish business activity within the Free Economic Zone and enjoy its incentives, a company has to fulfill the following conditions:

- a. Carry out industrial or export oriented business activities
- b. Export not less than 80% of its products / Services.

### **Free Economic Zones Investment Status**

Since its establishment, ZIPA has approved 65 projects under Free Economic Zones, where by 24 projects out of them are registered under free port zone. About 34 projects are owned by foreign investors and the remaining 31 projects are owned by locals. The distribution of projects by ownership is summarized in the table below:




### Micheweni Map



### 6.2 Fumba Zone

### **Fumba Zone - Land Use Plan**




#### 6.3 Amaan Industrial Park

### **Amaan Industrial Park - Land Use Plan**






#### 6.4 Maruhubi Zone

Zanzibar Investment Promotion Authority (ZIPA) is a one stop shop for investment promotion and facilitation in Zanzibar. It was established under Zanzibar Investment Promotion and Protection Act no 11 of 2004. It also operates and manages free economic zones.

## **Promotion Authority (ZIPA)**

### **ZIPA's Functions**

- Undertaking promotional activities

- Assisting in investors in acquiring land
- Facilitating the speedy acquisition of all due incentives, necessary authorization and decisions required by investors including work and resident permits, land leases and other infrastructure services
- Playing advisory role to the Government in all investment matters
- Overseeing the formation and effective functioning of Business Council
- Promoting working relationship with international organisations

ZIPA has long term cooperation with international institutions that work together in supporting investments. Organizations like UNIDO, UNDP, MIGA, WAIPA, UNCTAD, AfDB and EABC have for years worked with ZIPA to improve the investment climate in Zanzibar.

### 8.0 Tourist Attractions



#### The Jozani Forest Reserve

The Jozani Forest is located in the Central East Region of Zanzibar Island and is the home of rare Red Colobus Monkey, which is only prevalent to Zanzibar. The reserve also accommodates a large mangrove swamp and a tract of natural forest that is home to a few unique species including the Sykes monkey, bush babies, duikers, hyraxes, over 50 species of butterfly and 40 species of birds.

### Misali Island

The island of Misali, 17km off the west coast of Chake Chake, is one of the Pemba highlights, offering idyllic beaches, nature trails for spotting flying foxes (bats), good snorkeling and superb diving.

Misali's real treasury is its rich ecosystem, which boasts 42 types of coral , over three hundred species of fish, a rare subspecies of velvet monkeis, endangered colonies of flying foxes, nesting sites for green and hawksbill turtles, and a large, if rarely seen population of nocturnal coconut crabs.





### **Ngezi Forest**

The Ngezi Forest reserve is located on the northwestern corner of Pemba Island. This equatorial forest reserve contains rare trees, some not found anywhere else in the world. The wildlife includes indigenous flying foxes, blue duikers and several varieties of owls. The forest opens up on the east to Vumawimbi Beach, an isolated and untouched stretch of beach that will make you feel that you are the only person in the world.



### **Swim with Dolphins**

Dolphin tour experience can be found at Kizimkazi South Unguja, just an hour drive from Old Stone Town. Swimming with the dolphins is unforgettable experience. Kizimkazi is the place for dolphins sightings, home to both humpback and bottle-nose dolphins.



### Unwind on the beach

Need to soothe your soul? Then, Zanzibar beaches are the place to relax, unwind and breathe in new life. After a lengthy safari there is no better way to end your holiday than on the white, blissful beaches of Zanzibar, lazing away, sipping cocktails and living the island paradise dream



### **Snorkeling at Mnemba**

Recently declared a marine conservation area, Mnemba Island is a coral atoll, surrounded by thriving, vibrant reefs and the crystal clear Indian Ocean. The waters are teeming with an overwhelming number of beautiful tropical reef fish, and a wealth of marine creatures, from the majestic whale sharks to rare gem-like species of nudibranchs. Large pelagic creatures can often be seen passing by in the blue, and green turtles graze peaceably amongst the heads of plate and honeycomb corals.


