One of the best authors in the world and a self-made turnaround king Mr Grant Cardone, a world class real estate magnate uttered that people should not go to work just to work. One should go to work to prosper. Go to work for freedom. This is what high performing individuals do different than ordinary performers. High performing individuals and teams work for freedom. They work to experience new levels of performance and to push themselves to limits they have never known of themselves.

Copyright infringement in Botswana

Botswana inherited the Copyright Act of 1965 from the colonial administration, Britain. The Act of 1965 was reversed by the Copyright and Neighbouring Rights Act of 2000. A number of short comings were identified leading to the Amendment of the Act in 2005 which commenced in 2006. The Copyright and Neighbouring Rights Act provides that for a work to be protected in Botswana, it must have been created, published, recorded, performed or broadcast in Botswana; OR that the author or creator of a work is a Botswana national or

habitant of the country; OR that Botswana has an obligation to grant such protection to the creator.

Copyright is a type of intellectual property right that protects certain original works. Any unauthorized copying could amount to copyright infringement. Types of works protected in Botswana include: books, pamphlets, articles, speeches, lectures, addresses, musical works, photography and others. Institute of Development Management community is producing some of the above mentioned works and is preserved in the Institutional Repository (IR) to retain the institution's intellectual property.

In Botswana, Intellectual Property (IP) infringement is the damage of an intellectual property rights. That is making offering for sale and importing the goods without authorization or permission from the owner or creator of the work. The perpetrator may do so either with full knowledge or without any knowledge that their acts are illegal.

Companies and Intellectual Property Authority (CIPA) is mandated by the Industrial Property Act and the Copyright and Neighbouring Rights Act to enforce compliance and bring to justice those who do not comply. The copyright and Neighbouring Rights Acts provides that people who are guilty of infringement may be fined P20 000 or be imprisoned for a term not exceeding ten years or both. Upon subsequent or second conviction, the fine is a maximum of P30 000, minimum of P5 000 or a prison term not exceeding ten years or both.

Owners of Intellectual property also have the role to play in policing the use of their property. They must keep an eye on the industry and commercial market and take action if they notice any infringing activities. The law neither gives the right holders the right to take any civil action against infringers in order to recover their lost revenue nor gets the infringing products destroyed.

IDM FRANCISTOWN CAMPUS RESPONDS TO FLOOD DISASTER IN ZOROGA By Chris Moiketsi



IDM recently heeded the call to assist Zoroga community following the damages caused by floods in that area. The Institute has offered a temporary relief assistance of 11 portable toilets to help Zoroga Primary School manage sanitation issues in the school.

Zoroga settlement which is situated 40Km north of Nata along the A1 road has been prone to floods, having been one of the most hard-hit areas in 2017 by the Tropical Cyclone Dineo.

According to the Assistant Council Secretary for Tutume Sub District Council Mr Uyapo Mafunye, 791 people have been moved out of their homes to a temporary site where they have been assisted with tents. "168 houses collapsed due to the heavy rains experienced at the beginning of March this year, and six teachers' houses at the school are submerged in water. The toilets at the school are dysfunctional due to floods and at one point the school had to be closed down for three weeks", said Mr Mafunye during the official hand-over of relief aid to the community, which was graced by the Honorable Minister of Presidential Affairs, Governance and Public Administration Mr Nonofo Molefhi at the village Kgotla.

Mafunye mentioned that the situation forced them as the council in liaison with the Village Development Committee to look for help from organisations and individuals around the country.

When handing over the portable toilets to the school Headmaster, Ms Chambesi, IDM Botswana Country Director Dr Onalenna Seitio-



Kgokgwe extended IDM's sympathy to the flood-stricken people of Zoroga and that as a responsible corporate citizen, IDM has landed a hand to support efforts to help restore normalcy to the lives the community.

"As an institution that embraces education, we found it fit to work towards creating a normal and conducive environment for learners to ease their learning. The disaster also poses a serious health risk to the wellbeing of the community. The stagnant water and dysfunctional toilets increase chances of water-borne diseases such as malaria, diarrhoea and cholera. It is therefore important to prevent these diseases by providing proper sanitation facilities", said Dr. Kgokwe.

She further mentioned that IDM, through its Public Health faculty remains relevant to support government national programmes by offering courses such as the Bachelor of Public Health and the Bachelor of Community Development. "Our students and lecturers at our Francistown campus were moved by this unfortunate occurrence and responded accordingly to redress the situation."

IDM is a regional institution that was established in 1974 by the three governments of Botswana, Lesotho and Swaziland to support the management needs and build human resource capacity of the three nations.


